

# Cale's Story

*From Anger to Purpose*

At 25 years old, Karlin “Cale” Henry Villarson’s life is a story of growth, resilience, and hope. Originally from Haiti, Cale moved to the Dominican Republic at the age of eight with his family, including his three sisters and two brothers. **His journey hasn’t been easy, but through his determination and the support of 2nd Mile Missions, Cale has become a shining example of how faith, education, and love can transform a life.**



Growing up, Cale faced significant challenges. **With an absent father and a turbulent home life, he struggled with anger and feelings of alienation.** “As an immigrant child, I was angry at the whole world because I felt like everyone in it was against me,” he shares. **But everything changed when he began attending the 2nd Mile Education Center.**

At 2nd Mile, **Cale found a community of people who believed in him and surrounded him with God’s love.** They trusted him, encouraged him, and never judged him, helping him see the possibility of a better future. “It pushed me to want to be a better person,” Cale says.

One moment stands out as a turning point in his life. In second grade, after a particularly difficult morning witnessing his parents fight, Cale arrived at school full of anger. When a classmate bothered him, he lashed out and hit the boy. **But instead of reacting with frustration, his teacher, Mrs. Indira Mota, responded with kindness.** She asked Cale if everything was okay at home, and **her simple question opened a floodgate of emotion. For the first time, Cale felt seen, heard, and cared for in a way that brought healing to his heart.**

Cale credits 2nd Mile Missions not just with providing an education but with shaping his character. **Surrounded by role models who live their lives devoted to God and family, he has been deeply influenced by their examples.** “It’s almost impossible not to be influenced by these wonderful people,” he says. He treasures the wisdom of the Lao Tse proverb, *“If you give fish to a hungry man, you feed him for a day. If you teach him to fish, you nourish him for a lifetime,”* as a guiding principle for his own life.

As a young adult, Cale chose to give back to the organization that changed his life. **He worked as the Sponsorship Coordinator for 2nd Mile Missions, building relationships with students and striving to add value to their lives in the same way others had invested in him.** Now living in Fort Wayne, Indiana, under the Haitian Refugee Immigration Fairness Act, Cale works at Wildman, Inc., and is finding a new church community to grow with.

**Cale’s dreams are as big as his heart.** At the top of his list is discovering God’s purpose for his life. He hopes to achieve financial freedom to care for a future family, to be a better father than his own, and to use his talents, skills, and resources to help others become the best version of themselves.
