### What We Do

Primarily focused on removing the educational barriers that keep over 100,000 students nationwide from attending school, 2nd Mile Missions exists to educate kids in the Dominican Republic and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Through our initiatives, we aim to equip our students with the tools needed to break free from the spiritual, educational, and generational cycles of poverty that have entrapped them.

What began as a humble twoclassroom school nestled behind a small church in the village of Monte Verde has blossomed into the construction of two schools, providing a quality, Christ-centered education to nearly 1,200 children annually.

According to the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Article 26, everyone has the right to education. However, many children around the world experience barriers that make this basic human right difficult to access. In the Dominican Republic, 100,000+ children are denied access to public education every year due to overcrowding and staffing issues. For us, that's a problem.

Education changes everything. It is one of the strongest instruments for reducing poverty and improving health, gender equality, peace, and stability. Education needs to be accessible, affordable, and high-quality so students, families, and communities can flourish. We believe long-lasting change comes from an education rooted in the values of Jesus. By integrating a biblical worldview into school curriculum, it can transform the minds and spirits of children who grow up to be the world's next thinkers, innovators, and leaders.

### The Gift of Access

The 2nd Mile Missions Sponsorship Program exists to provide educational opportunities and spiritual enrichment to help children disrupt the cycle of poverty in their community. Imagine your child being turned away from attending your local public school because classrooms are at capacity. Your only choice is to send them to private school, which can cost up to \$200/month, but you are making less than \$10/day. It's a choice no parent should have to make, but one many parents in the Dominican Republic are faced with. **Our goal is to remove barriers like these that prevent children in the DR from accessing quality education.** We do this by matching students from the DR with individuals from the US, who provide scholarships to fund education programs that benefit the sponsored students.

During the 2023-24 school year, the sponsorship program experienced tremendous growth. In Fall 2023, we set a goal of sponsoring an additional 30 students at Hope Academy. Through our marketing efforts and opportunities to share publicly about sponsorship, we gained 36 new sponsors that are covering 52 new sponsorships. Words cannot express how grateful we are that these **children** have been given the access to quality, Christ-centered education.



I am grateful for the difference we are making in Bavaro and Friusa by preparing our students to transform the entire community.

Ivonne shared how her mom taught her to be the best she can be in whatever she does - something she has learned to appreciate more since becoming a teacher.

This past year, her first teaching 4th grade, was a year of growth and perseverance. Dealing with a variety of behavior issues made each day a challenge. However, Ivonne set a goal to use her student's behavior as an opportunity to teach them about respect, a lesson woven throughout her teaching all year.

Ivonne knows teachers have many roles in their student's lives - mother, counselor, and nurse to name a few, and it's important to show empathy in dealing with each of the precious little people God places in her care. Ivonne's ability to accept her students right where they are, while loving them enough to challenge them to be the best they can be, will undoubtedly transform their lives beyond their time in her classroom.

Do You Have a "YES Story?"

Addison Whitaker, a senior at Warsaw High School, went on a 2nd Mile Missions Awareness Trip to the DR with Wildman in October 2023. Her "Yes Story" started by simply saying yes to going on the trip. "My Grandpa was a pastor and while growing up and attending his church, I always knew I wanted to go on a mission trip. So when Leslie Wildman asked me and a friend to go on a trip to the DR, I knew right away, that God was telling me to go. I am so glad I said "yes," because that trip changed my life forever."

"On the plane ride home, I started brainstorming ideas about starting a club at the high school and a few months later, the 2nd Mile Club started meeting. **Our main goal is to help disrupt the cycle of poverty locally and abroad.** We also hope to spread awareness to other people our age about poverty."



Addison shares, "Saying yes has changed me in so many ways. Seeing 2nd Mile Missions help children go to school and get the education they need is so incredibly inspiring. I have grown much closer to God through this journey. He has given me many amazing opportunities and I feel like I am doing what He has led me to do."

Each of us, at some point in our walk with the Lord, will be given an opportunity, like Addison, to answer "yes" to whatever God is asking us to do. **What is your "yes" story?**19



Vida Plena means "full life," which is the goal for the women who are employed in the workshop. Vida Plena exists to see the women flourish economically, emotionally, physically, and spiritually. This is accomplished through artisan trade training, adult literacy classes, and dignified employment.

2nd Mile Missions supports Vida Plena by partnering to provide adult literacy classes and spiritual enrichment to the women employed by Vida Plena.

#### **Impact Spotlight**

In February 2023, Caleb & Courtney France applied to the US Citizenship & Immigration Service's "Haitian Parole Process" as beneficiaries for two incredibly talented team members working in the DR as Haitian refugees. Miraculously, both Mirtha (Vida Plena Shop Manager) and Cale (2nd Mile Missions Sponsorship Coordinator) were approved for 2 year visas to work and study in the US. Mirtha and Cale arrived in Chicago on December 18th and are now living and working in Chicago and Fort Wayne, Indiana, respectively.

Led by our Operations Manager. Sue Vercauteren, and Executive Director, Mason McIntyre, we embarked on a series of vision trips alongside CEO, Josh Wildman, and his wife, Leslie, and their dedicated team. These trips serve as powerful reminders of the importance of giving back. Through their annual contributions. Wildman ensures that 20% of their profit goes towards supporting local and global organizations like 2nd Mile Missions. These trips not only provide tangible experiences, but also ignite a sense of purpose among Wildman employees. reminding them that their hard work directly contributes to creating a better world.





### **Monte Verde Church**



In the heart of Monte Verde stands a humble church, where the vision of 2nd Mile Missions was born. It was here in 2006 that our founders, Rod and Nancy Wildman, had their hearts shattered for the children in this community. Two small classrooms in the back of this church marked the beginning of a journey to change lives.

Under the lasting leadership of Pastor Elvis, **the church continues to be a beacon of hope in a dark and broken community.** Even as 2nd Mile Missions has expanded its reach beyond the church school with the 2nd Mile Education Center and Hope Academy, Pastor Elvis continues to provide education for local children at the church.

In October 2023, Eduardo Castillo, Country Director, led a project to replace the worn-out roof, a crucial step after Hurricane Fiona left its

mark in the fall of 2022. With support of Warsaw Community Church and several generous donors, the church received a facelift, symbolizing renewal and resilience. In January, a team from Wildman, added the final touches, painting the church's exterior.

We're grateful for Pastor Elvis and his long standing commitment to serving this community. **The** church in Monte Verde remains a testament to the power of faith and partnership, and will always be the heart and soul of 2nd Mile Missions.




Our partnership with Outcast Redeemed began with a chance encounter in April 2022, during a work trip in the Dominican Republic for our US staff members. Through random connections, God brought us together, and since then, our collaboration has only strengthened.

In January 2023, a significant step was taken as Outcast Redeemed purchased a piece of property from us adjacent to the church in Monte Verde. During our ownership, this property had remained idle for about six years. But immediately after the purchase, Outcast Redeemed breathed new life into it, adding a pavilion, kitchen, and bathrooms, transforming it into a functional space to provide ministry opportunities to the residents of Monte Verde. The improved property has served as a valuable asset for the community, and we have benefitted from it as well on our mission trips, allowing us to better serve the children and families in Monte Verde.




